

Figure 1. Safe operating area




Figure 2. Normalized transient thermal impedance




Figure 3. Typical output characteristics




Figure 4. Typical transfer characteristics




Figure 5. Typical gate charge characteristics




Figure 6. Typical drain-source on-resistance












Figure 7. Typical capacitance characteristics

Figure 13. Typical reverse diode forward characteristics

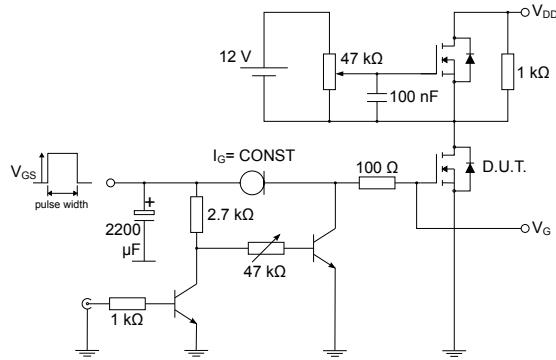

Figure 14. Test circuit for resistive load switching times




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Figure 15. Test circuit for gate charge behavior



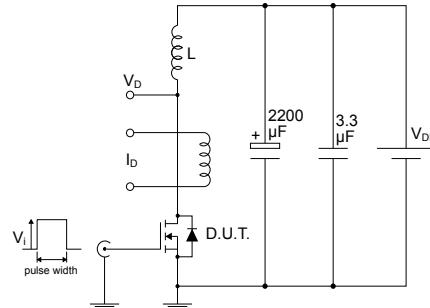
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Figure 16. Test circuit for inductive load switching and diode recovery times




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Figure 17. Unclamped inductive load test circuit




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Figure 18. Unclamped inductive waveform



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Figure 19. Switching time waveform





Figure 20. DPAK (TO-252) type C3 package outline





Figure 21. DPAK (TO-252) type E package outline



Figure 22. DPAK (TO-252) recommended footprint (dimensions are in mm)






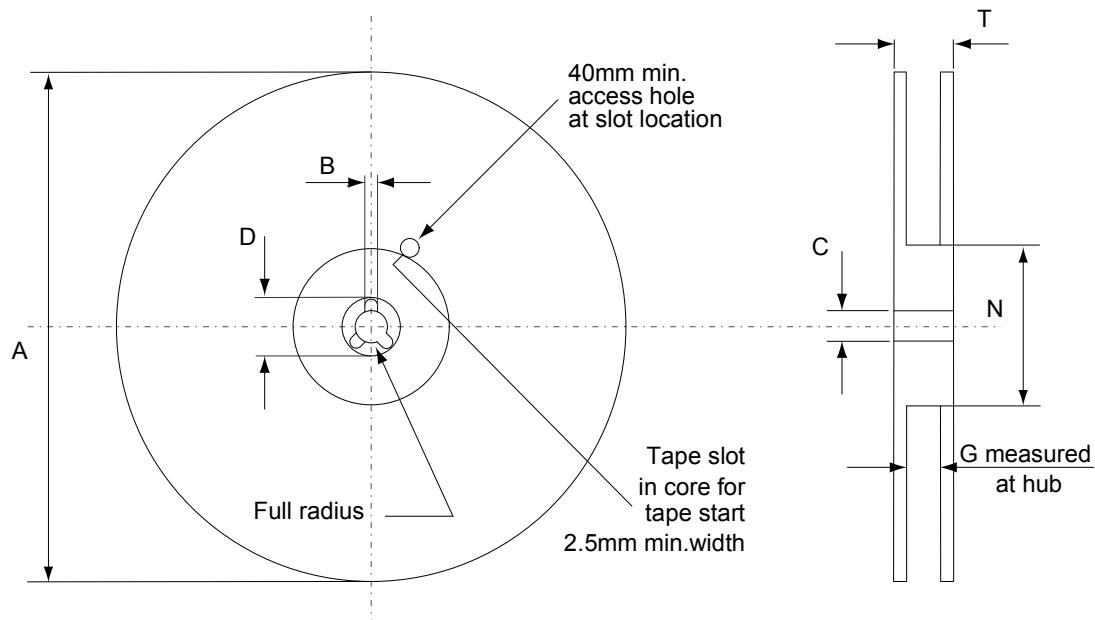
